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The City of Burleson is working on two road construction projects that will make getting from one place to another smoother and quicker. Alsbury Boulevard, between Edgehill Road and Summercrest Boulevard, is being completely reconstructed and Arnold Avenue will be extended from the current dead end to Hwy. 174, across from Elk Drive.

Alsbury Boulevard, Edgehill Road to Summercrest Boulevard

- Began Oct. 26, 2009; expected to be substantially complete by February 2010.
- Complete reconstruction of Alsbury Boulevard, between Edgehill Road and Summercrest Boulevard, from asphalt to concrete. The project also includes a signal at Summercrest and Alsbury.
- Total estimated cost for the project, including design, right-of-way acquisition and construction is \$551,000. This project was part of Proposition #2 in the 2005-2009 Capital Improvements Program that was voted on by residents in September 2004. The project is being paid for via general obligation bonds and certificates of obligation in the 2005-2009 bond program.

Arnold Avenue Extension

- Began in November 2009; expected to be substantially complete by July 2010.
- The project includes a signalized in/out alternative to Miles Avenue. It adds circulation between Arnold Avenue and Hidden Creek Parkway. The extension of Arnold Avenue will provide alternative access to/from Hidden Creek Parkway, Chisenhall Park and the future Dillmore Park and trails.
- Citizens approved Proposition #2 of the Capital Improvements Bond Election in September 2004. Proposition #2 included the extension of Arnold Avenue where it currently dead ends, and connect it to Hwy. 174, across from Elk Drive. The project is being paid for out of general obligation bonds and associated escrows collected by the City. The total estimated cost for the project, including design, right-of-way acquisition and construction is \$643,000.
