Larry Neagle, 703 Windridge, Burleson, TX, sent email to Mayor, Council and City Manager Curtis E. Hawk. Believes the Mayor was wrongly accused but stands behind Angela Cox's statement that the City of Burleson wanted to stop the Burleson Tea Party.
