II. General Information and Status Updates

A. Mayor Vera Calvin Plaza in Old Town Weekly Update

Construction of the Mayor Vera Calvin Plaza is on schedule

Highlights:

- Pavilion slabs have been poured
- Restroom/storage building slab has been poured

Construction activity for next week, September 9 - 13, will include:

- Continue red trolley grade beam - plinths
- Continue work for site foundations
- Continue electric branch/site circuits

B. Council Retreat

The City Council will be conducting an annual retreat on Saturday, November 9, 2019, from 9 am to 3 pm. The primary purpose of the retreat is to develop a shared vision for the city and a corresponding set of strategies to achieve these objectives over time. The City Manager has hired Rick Robinson with the Ramsee Consulting Group to facilitate the discussion. In early October, Mr. Robinson will be meeting with individual City

Council members to solicit input on the design and specific agenda for the retreat. This will ensure that the retreat discussion is focused on topics important to the Council and that it is a productive use of time. The location of the retreat has not yet been determined, but we wanted to reserve the date on your calendar. Once the location has been finalized, we will forward it to you in a future Friday report.

C. Trash and Recycling Updates Community Outreach

In May and June 2018, the city conducted public outreach asking residents what they would like to see in their trash and recycling services. An online and print survey was available and eight public meetings were held throughout the community, including an online town hall.

Over 1,700 surveys were returned, and city staff utilized this input to make the following changes to Burleson's trash and recycling program.

- Convert to 65-gallon recycling carts.
- Keep solid waste pick up at twice a week.
- Allow customers to set out a container for their trash if they would like, but the city would not provide containers. All trash in containers must be bagged and tied.
- Collect small bulk and brush items (under 3 cubic yards) weekly.
- Discontinue Mulch and Recycling Center operations.
- Include two free trips to the landfill per year.

Starting October 1, 2019, weekly collection of small brush and bulky items will start, monthly collection of large brush and bulky items will continue as is. The city's Mulch Center's last day of operation will be September 28, 2019. Also, starting October 1 residents can begin using their own garbage containers, if they would like. Solid waste can still be set on the curb in trash bags.

Recycling carts will be delivered to Burleson homes and businesses December 3 through December 20, 2019. Starting January 6, 2020, automated collection of recycling carts will begin, and residents will no longer be able to use the smaller recycling bins they are currently utilizing.

Starting **October 1, 2019** look for the following updates:

- Weekly collection of small brush and bulky items (under 3 cubic yards) will begin. Three (3) cubic yards is approximately the size of three recliners.
- Monthly collection of large brush and bulky items will continue as is, per your zone.
- Residents can begin using their own garbage containers (optional), maximum size 96 gallons. Containers may be purchased at any local home improvement store. Solid waste can still be placed curbside in tied trash bags.
- Residents will have free access to Turkey Creek Landfill 9100 S. I-35W, Alvarado, Texas 76009. Limit two (2) trips per year.
- The city's Mulch Center's last day of operation will be September 28, 2019.



Trash must be contained Bags should not bear a weight in excess of 35 lbs.
