## II. General Information and Status Updates

### A. Mayor Vera Calvin Plaza in Old Town Weekly Update

Construction of the Mayor Vera Calvin Plaza remains on schedule and within budget.

Construction activity for next week, November 11 - 15, will include:

- Continue electric branch/site circuits
- Electrical room raceways
- Train platform conduit
- Train platform steel welding
- Continue brickwork at pavilions, restroom and train platform

ROW Parking/Storm Line Extension:

- Work has begun in the right of way to construct parking (49 new stalls), sidewalks, and streetscape
- City staff and Contractor, Hill & Wilkinson, have coordinated with local businesses to plan work in phases that lessens impact as much as possible
- This work will continue in stages until early March
- CURRENT STAGE: Wilson St. Storm line extension: 10/28 - 11/11

#### **B. BRiCk Maintenance**

There are two current maintenance issues staff are in the process of resolving. The first is a problem with the backwash valve for the indoor and outdoor pool. The valve is used to move water through the filtration system to clean the system out. A temporary solution is in place until a permanent repair can be made. No disruption of service is expected. The second issue is with a sewer line approximately 140 feet away from the building. Staff had a plumbing company evaluate the system, and they sent a camera into the pipe. It was discovered that a section of the pipe has separated, causing the clogs. A solution for repair is currently being evaluated. There is currently no significant disruption to service.

#### **C. Tree Replacement at Centennial Park**

Parks staff replaced twenty-two trees this week at Centennial Park. The elm trees are suspected of having suffered from a disease called cotton root rot. The trees have been replaced with live oak trees, which are more resistant to the disease. Additionally, six trees were replaced at Chisenhall Fields.

#### **D. Retail lease at 114 W. Ellison St. (West Building)**

On September 30, 2019, staff received notice from the tenant at 114 W. Ellison St., Ensemble Media Group dba JoCo Community Radio, that they would be evacuating by midnight of October 31, 2019. The tenant has since removed all their furnishings and will be terminating all utilities. Staff has confirmed that the unit was left in good condition and will return \$1,650 deposit, per the lease agreement. Tenant terminated the agreement in good standing and has a zero balance with the City.

**E. Smoke Detector Campaign**

The 5th Annual Smoke Detector Campaign was held November 2 and spearheaded by Fire Inspector/Investigator Jessica Eiswald. The crew from Fire Station 1, along with volunteers, canvassed 237 homes and installed 87 smoke detectors in 24 houses. A big thank you to Jessica and the volunteers that made our community safer through this campaign.

**F. Walking Connect with Council**

Mayor Shetter and Councilmember Stuart Gillaspie strolled around Bailey Lake on November 2 while speaking with residents in a Connect with Council event. They were joined by a Master Naturalist who was on-hand to discuss flora and fauna native to the area.



**G. Campos elected secretary of state association**

Burleson City Secretary Amanda Campos was elected secretary of the Texas Municipal Clerks Association, Inc., at its annual meeting held in Fort Worth on October 24, 2019.

The Texas Municipal Clerks Association, Inc., is a statewide association with over 1,000 members. The Association operates the Texas Municipal Clerks Certification Program located at the University of North Texas, Denton. The Certification Program is recognized and endorsed by §22.074 of the Local Government Code, Vernon's Annotated Civil Statutes. TMCA, Inc., publishes the Texas Municipal Election Law Manual, the Texas Municipal Law and Procedure Manual and the Texas Municipal Clerks Handbook.

Campos will be charged with the responsibility of accomplishing the goals and objectives of TMCA, Inc. The Association is dedicated to serving the demands of excellence in Texas' local government and public problem solving. Its principal missions are to motivate Texas city clerks and city secretaries to become leaders in their fields of governance and to provide an educational program for the beginning and career city clerk and city secretary.

**H. 3820 S. Burleson Blvd Zone Change Request**

A zoning change request from A, Agriculture to SP, Site Plan has been received for this address for the purpose of constructing a used car sales center. This item was initially placed on the November 12 P&Z and December 9 City Council agendas. Part of the public notification is placing signs on the property 10 days prior to the P&Z Public Hearing. Staff realized this week that the signs had not been placed. This item will be continued to the December 12 P&Z meeting and January 6 Council meeting.

# Household Hazardous Waste Event – November 2



## Quarterly Report Summary

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In February 2019, the Burleson Police Department transitioned from Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) summary reporting to incident based reporting (NIBRS). This is a state mandated change. There are several differences between summary reporting and incident based reporting. The biggest change is that summary reporting would only report the highest crime in a single incident, whereas Incident Based Reporting reports all offenses that occurred. This means there will be an increase in the number of offenses being reported, when comparing them to UCR Summary Reports from the past. The statistics attached to the Quarterly Report are for analysis purposes only and will differ from those reported to the FBI as part of the Uniform Crime Reports. ### Crimes Against Persons

- Crimes Against Persons are up 6.1% overall.
- The largest increase was in Assaultive Offenses, which increased from 305 at this point last year to 328 this year.
  - The category of assaultive crimes that increased the most was intimidation assault. Intimidation assault increased by 14 offenses year-to-date (77.8%), due mostly to an increase in harassment cases.
  - Aggravated assaults increased slightly (five offenses year to date). Grouped within this category, strangulations cases increased by one year-to-date.

### Crimes Against Property

- Crimes Against Property is down 4.8% overall.
- Burglary of Motor Vehicles has increased by 15 offense YTD. Additionally, Motor Vehicle Thefts increased 21 offenses (60%). The Tri-County Auto Theft Task Force is tracking several known suspects/groups in the area.
- Vandalism has decreased by 37 offenses (32.5%), making it the largest decrease of any category of property crime.
- Burglary has also decreased by 20.5% or 17 offenses.

### Crimes Against Society

- Crimes Against Society is down 11.7%.
- The largest decrease was in Drug/Narcotic Violations (down 41 offenses).
- Weapon Law Violations increased 28.6% or 6 offenses.

### Group B Crimes

- Group B Crimes increased 65.6% year to date.
- The largest increase is in the category of DWI, which increased 41 offenses year to date.
- Drunkenness is a close second, increasing by 37 offenses year to date (284.6%).
