II. General Information and Status Updates

A. Ground spraying for mosquitos in Zone 11 this Friday & Saturday

Today, June 17, 2021, the City's environmental services division was notified that a mosquito trap tested positive for West Nile virus. The area is:

- Zone 11 is in the area of John Jones Drive, Remington Circle, CR 714, and Broad Valley Ct. [View Map](#)

The City of Burleson will conduct ground-based spraying for mosquitoes between 9 p.m. and 6 a.m. on Friday, June 18, and then again on Saturday, June 19. The ground spraying will be performed in targeted subdivision within the designated spray zones.

In the event of rain or if wind speeds are above 10 miles per hour, the spraying may be rescheduled. This method of spraying targets flying mosquitoes that come in contact with the pesticide in the spray or fog. These times have been chosen because they are the times that most mosquitoes are active (flying).

B. City Landscape Beds

Plants throughout the city have been impacted by the February cold snap, especially the newer plants that were still establishing root systems. The damages caused become more apparent as we advance in the growing season and plants are not recovering or performing the way they normally would.

The Parks and Recreation Department continues its efforts in extracting plant material that is either dead or deemed not likely to recover. Concurrently, plans are in place to have the material replanted. Additionally, high temperatures adversely impact planting operations as the heat adds to the stress that new plantings are already under by virtue of their being replanted. Staff will work to remove the plantings as they are identified and anticipate re-planting in the fall when it cools off enough to build healthy root systems with the new plantings.

C. Hot Sounds of Summer concerts

D. Minute to Win it in the Plaza


