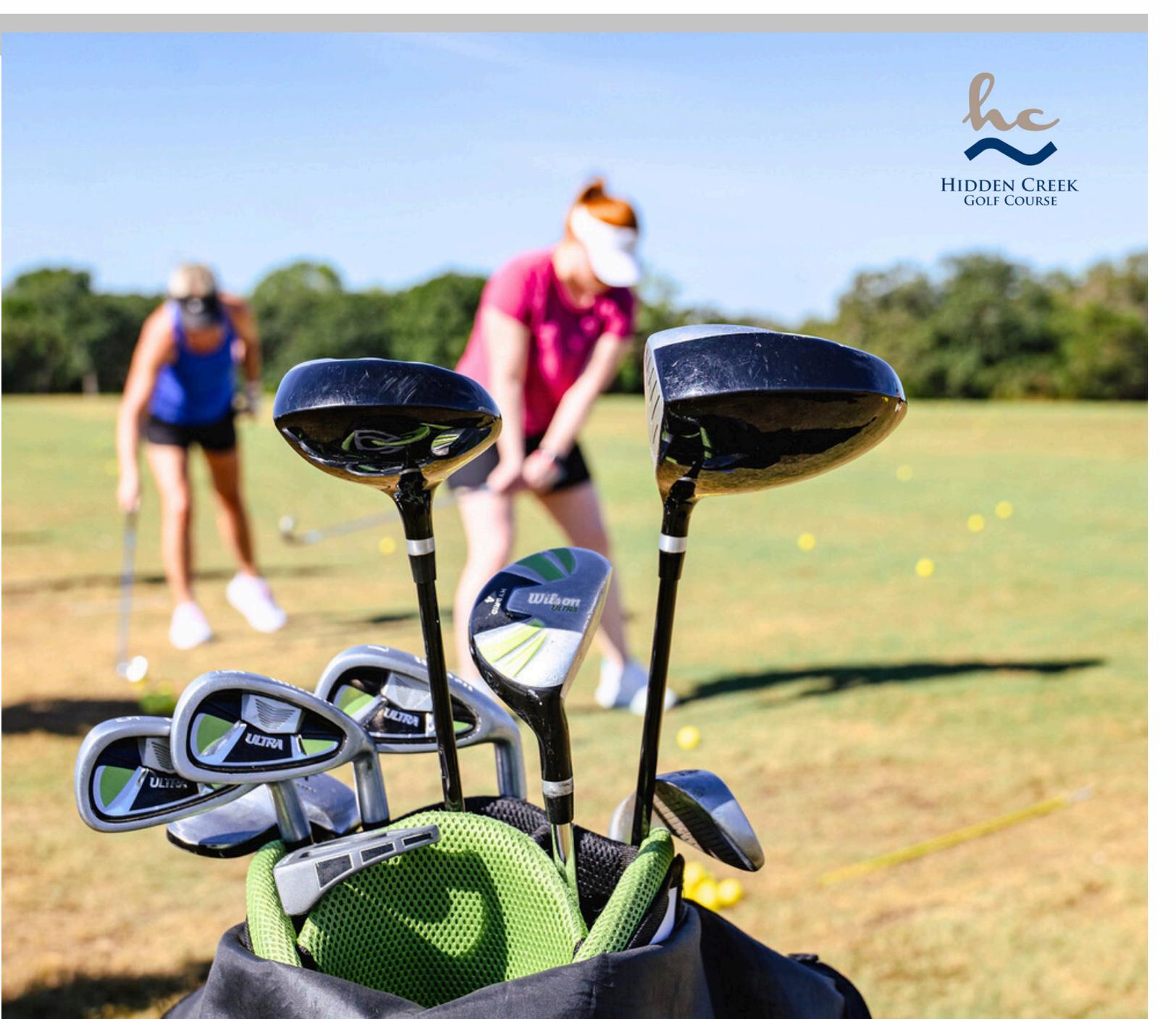

## **II. GENERAL AND STATUS UPDATES**

### **A. BTX CORE: IT'S WHO WE ARE**

City Manager Tommy Ludwig officially launched the city of Burleson's refreshed core values at the city's holiday luncheon in December. As the city moves into 2026, staff will continue sharing what BTX Core represents and recognizing employees who live out these values each day.

The updated BTX Core values were developed through thoughtful input from employees across the organization, leadership discussions and careful consideration of the city's future direction. These values are designed to better reflect a shared vision and guide how the city grows and evolves together.

More than just words, the BTX Core values now serve as the foundation of the city's culture and the standards staff set for themselves. They will shape how

work is approached, guide interactions and influence decisions at every level. In the coming months, employees will see these values reflected in policies, programs, performance reviews and day-to-day operations.

Employees are encouraged to reflect on the values and consider how they can be embodied in their roles. Ongoing feedback and commitment will be essential as the organization moves forward together.



## **B. BTX CORE SHOUTOUT**

Each week, the city will share a quick shoutout recognizing employees who exemplify one of the BTX CORE values. The inaugural BTX Core Shoutout goes to **Jay Davis with the Police Department and Kim Peckler with Animal Services** for demonstrating the core value of **COLLABORATION**.



Jay and Kim worked together to coordinate the distribution of more than 700 informational flyers to homes in the Shady Oaks neighborhood, a known egret nesting area. The flyers helped educate residents on how to prevent egrets from nesting on their streets.

In previous years, animal control officers spent multiple days walking neighborhoods to deliver flyers, taking time away from their regular duties. Jay coordinated with members of Citizens on Patrol to assist with the distribution. The partnership not only saved staff time but also increased the presence of Citizens on Patrol in the neighborhood, helping residents become more familiar with the program.

The effort was a win for residents, staff and volunteers and is a great example of collaboration at its best.

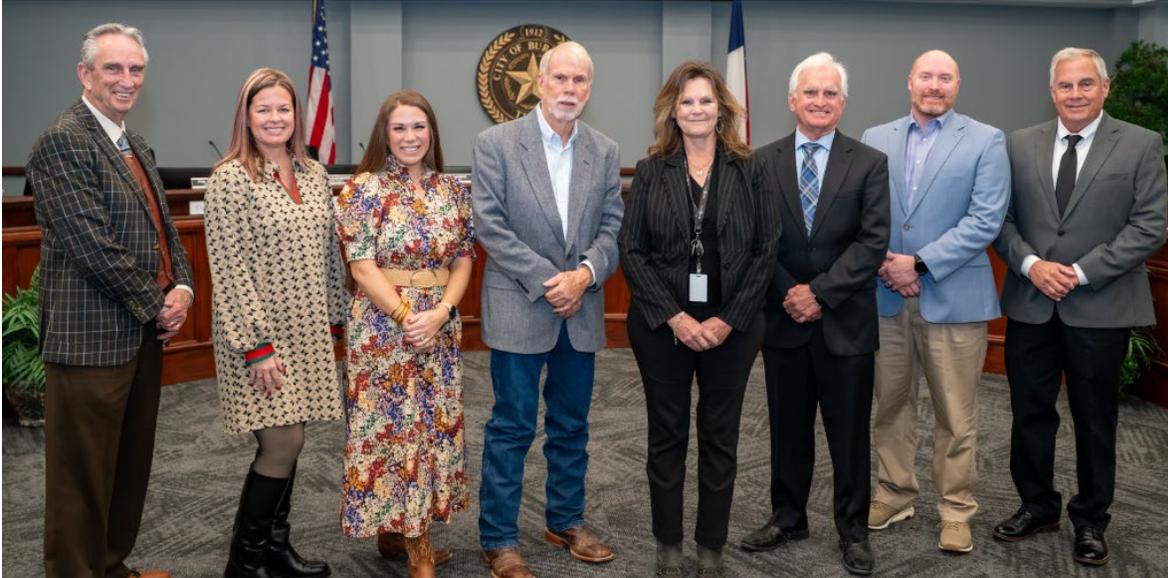
## **C. 2025 TOURISM STATS**

The city recorded a total of **159,000 overnight trips**, representing a **0.8% increase** year-over-year. These visitors accounted for **469,400 total visit nights**, which is a **2.4% rise** compared to the previous year. Economically, the impact was significant, with total visitor spending reaching **\$85.1 million**, a notable **10.3% increase** year-over-year. The data shows that the Houston-The Woodlands area was the top origin for these overnight trips and visit nights. Additionally, the majority of visitors stayed for shorter durations of **2-3 days**, and a significant

portion of the visitor demographic came from households with a median income between **\$75,000 and \$100,000**.

## E. BURLESON PUBLIC LIBRARY PROGRAMMING

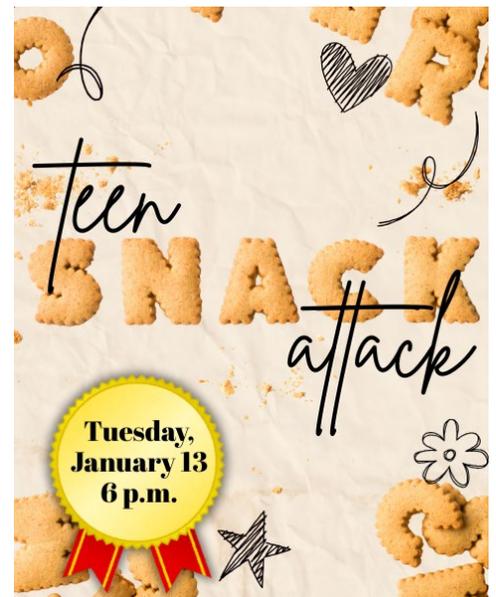
### Hibernation Program with the Texas Master Naturalists

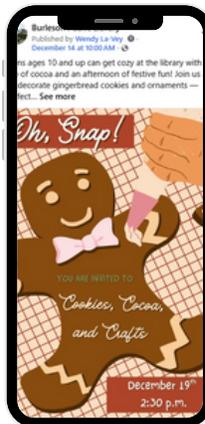

# Safety Training Works



Employee safety training – including new employee orientations, regular safety meetings, and “toolbox” or “tailgate” talks – are proven to prevent injuries, save lives, and protect property. The implementation of safety training, along with other accident prevention measures, establishes a “culture of safety” at an organization. The Pool’s [Accident Prevention Plan Development Guide](#) provides an accident prevention plan blueprint, which includes employee education, awareness, and training as part of its seven key components. In addition, the Pool’s [Sample Safety Manual](#) includes an example safety education and training policy.

## Immediate Safety Training Benefits:

- Increases supervisors’ and employees’ (especially new employee) awareness of risk management and defines ownership of safety functions.
- Identifies procedures and mitigates hazards and exposures that can cause injury, death, or property damage.
- Reduces accidents, injuries, and property damage.
- Increases employee morale through the development of a culture of safety.

## Safety Training Questions:

- Who needs training? Everyone!
- How often will training be conducted and who will be responsible for it? Engage supervisors and ensure they “practice what they preach.”
- What topics will be covered during regular safety training and/or new employee orientation?
- How will training be provided and documented? Develop a training calendar and checklist for your organization and remember K.I.S.S. (Keep it Simple for Safety).
- What is the difference between toolbox/tailgate training and safety training meetings? Toolbox/tailgate training meetings are typically more brief, informal safety discussions and can be done around the tailgate of a truck or jobsite to address specific hazards, processes, and safe work practices for work that will be done that day. These meetings are usually held at the beginning of each workday. Safety training programs are designed for more in-depth processes to heighten employee awareness.

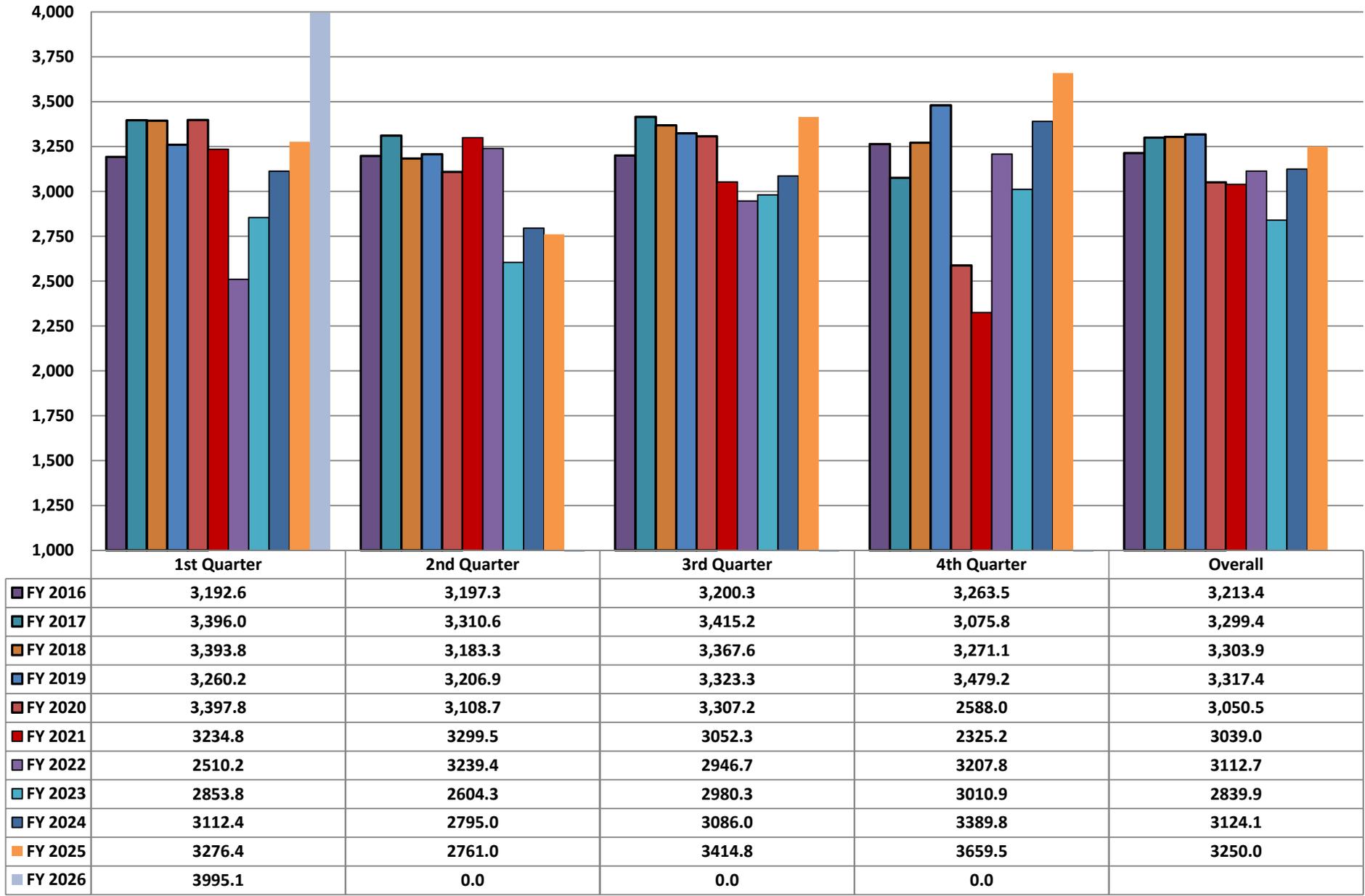

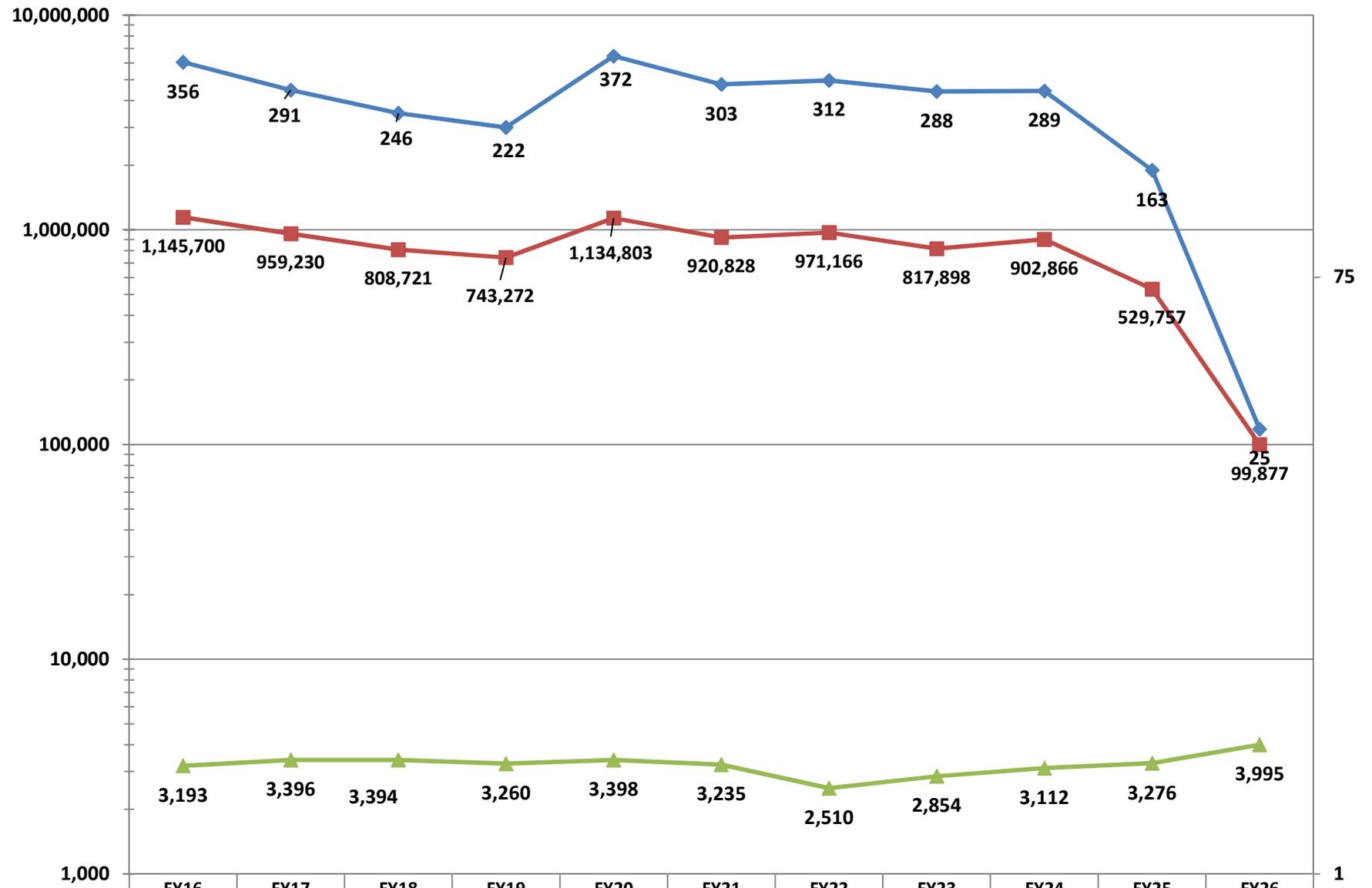
