


Field Services

All Calls for Service are handled within 24 hours




The Animal Services division responds to approximately 2,000 calls for service each year. Trends usually show numbers peaking in the warmest months and declining in the coldest.

Actions Taken by Officers



Attempts to educate and mediate are most often the first step in resolving a dispute. When these techniques fail or are ignored, a written warning or citation could be issued. These methods help to reduce the number of repeat offenders and animals impounded, and more effectively manage long-term problems. These actions are taken to enhance public safety and animal welfare.


Intake Information



Burluson Animal Shelter intakes about 2,000 animals per year and averages about 165 animals per month. Above, you will see monthly intake data, broken down by species and intake type.


Euthanasia Information

The chart below depicts the breakdown of euthanasia numbers by reason for the fiscal year.




General Information

Phone calls and visitors are depicted in the graph above. Phone calls typically increase with seasonal changes, and visitor numbers tend to fluctuate unpredictably.




Volunteers

Total Volunteer Hours - Yearly Comparison





Animal Quarantine



Animals that bite are subject to quarantine and must be confined for not less than 10 days from the date of the bite, at the owner's expense.
