He invented the Guit-Steel and he's bringing it to Burleson June 22 for the fourth week of the five-week Hot Sounds of Summer Concert Series in Old Town.

In the mid-1980s, Junior Brown invented the double-necked guitar, a combination of the standard guitar and a steel guitar. By the 1990s, Junior and his family moved to Austin where he played honky tonk and country and western at the Continental Club. Now, Brown is bringing his singing, songwriting and instrumental skills to the Friday night concert on the City's stage at the corner of Ellison and Wilson streets (124 W. Ellison St.). This is a free celebration. All you have to bring is your blanket or chair for the 7:30 p.m. start.

This year marks the 13th anniversary of the Hot Sounds of Summer Concert Series. The City's parks and recreation department kicked off the free concerts in Old Town in 2000. The Hot Sounds of Summer concert lineup for 2012 includes Josh Weathers (rock and funk, June 1), Charlie Robison (country, June 8), FastLane (tribute to the Eagles, June 15) and The Spazmatics (1980s retro, June 29).

The Hot Sounds of Summer Concert Series' grand finale is July 4th when Grammy Award winner Asleep at the Wheel headlines the City's Independence Day Fireworks Show at Chisenhall Fields Sports Complex, 500 W. Hidden Creek Pkwy. Bring your chairs and your friends July 4th and celebrate the nation's birthday. The gates open at 5 p.m. The concert is at 7:30 p.m.
