A Hot Sounds of Summer concert series favorite is returning June 29 to close out the City's free series in Old Town Burleson.

The Spazmatics bring the ultimate new wave '80s show to the City stage at the corner of Ellison and Wilson streets (124 W. Ellison St.). The 90-minute show starts at 7:30 p.m. The Spazmatics are an act, complete with skinny ties, horn-rimmed glasses, and all of the dance steps and sounds of the 1980s. The concert list includes songs made famous by Billy Idol, David Bowie, Wham, The Cure, Cyndi Lauper, Men At Work, Rick Springfield, Devo, Duran Duran, INXS, B-52s, Tears For Fears, Adam Ant, Madonna, The Cars, The Clash, Flock of Seagulls, and Oingo Bongo.

All you need June 29 is a lawn chair or blanket, and maybe some sunscreen and, you are set for the show! Event coordinators advise concert-goers to leave the glass bottles at home. Arrive early to eat at the restaurants and stroll through the shops in Old Town. You may also bring your own picnic and refreshments, including alcohol, but drink responsibly. The Burleson Police Department said it will not tolerate disorderly conduct or public intoxication at the Hot Sounds concerts.

This year marks the 13th anniversary of the Hot Sounds of Summer Concert Series. The City's parks and recreation department kicked off the free concerts in Old Town in 2000. The Hot Sounds of Summer concert lineup for 2012 includes Josh Weathers (rock and funk, June 1), Charlie Robison (country, June 8), FastLane (tribute to the Eagles, June 15) and Junior Brown (honky tonk, June 22).

The Hot Sounds of Summer Concert Series' grand finale is July 4th when Grammy Award winner Asleep at the Wheel headlines the City's Independence Day Fireworks Show at Chisenhall Fields Sports Complex, 500 W. Hidden Creek Pkwy. Bring your chairs and your friends July 4th and celebrate the nation's birthday. The gates open at 5 p.m. The concert is at 7:30 p.m.
