Russell Farm welcomes J. Christopher White, an artist, sculptor and poet; for a weeklong seminar, Nov. 12-16. The seminar is called Maximize Movement. Limited space is still available for this seminar.

White's use of S-curves, negative spaces, and fluid lines into shimmering ribbons of wood, has broken the mold. White is a world renowned sculptor who has won countless awards. He recently received first place honors with "Barn Swallows" for Interpretive Sculpture in the World Class 2009 World Championship Wildfowl Competition, which is the largest bird carving competition in the world.

"It is a great honor to have Christopher White come to Burleson," said Pete McCaskill, president of the Russell Farm Art Committee.

Russell Farm is an historic farm on the south side of Burleson that was donated to the City of Burleson by the Boren family for historical, art and agricultural/natural uses. The 30-acre property is located at 405 W. County Road 714. The Russell Farm Art Center is a Texas chartered 501(c) (3) non profit organization that works in conjunction with the City of Burleson to offer art classes at Russell Farm.
