You can't see it yet, but in a few weeks you'll be able to see the City of Burleson's newest elevated storage tank at Hidden Creek Golf Course.

The 1 million gallon elevated water storage tank will be located at the southeast corner of Dobson Street and Hidden Creek Parkway. When it is finished, the tank will be 120 feet tall. A 16-inch water line that will service the new tank will be constructed from Alsbury Boulevard south to Hidden Creek Parkway.

The tank will look like the City tank located at Turkey Peak. The new tank will be painted white and will be embossed with the City of Burleson logo. The tower will go up seven feet at a time. The storage tank site is off the road, surrounded by trees, so it may be a month before the tank is easily visible.

The work on the water line will begin in late June/early July. The water line project will include some partial and full road closures.

The proposed 16-inch waterline will begin at the pump station located at the west end of Industrial Park Boulevard. The alignment will proceed south, adjacent to the Union Pacific Railroad right-of-way, to the south property line of the Halliburton property in the 600 block of North Burleson Boulevard. The water line will turn east to the Texas Department of Transportation service road right-of-way. The line will then be routed in a southwesterly direction adjacent to the TxDOT right-of-way, passing under Hwy. 174, to the north end of Commerce Street. The line will be installed along the length of Commerce Street to Miller Street. The water line will then proceed in an easterly direction along Miller Street to the east end of Miller Court. The final leg will go in a southeasterly direction where it will end at the north end of Hidden Creek Golf Course.
