SPAZMATICS HEADLINE CITY'S FOURTH OF JULY CELEBRATION

A Burleson favorite, the Spazmatics, will be headlining the City's free Fourth of July concert at Chisenhall Fields Sports Complex. The Spazmatics will take the stage at 7:30 p.m. on Thursday, July 4, for a 90-minute show. To catch the show, bring your chairs and blankets – leave alcoholic beverages at home; City ordinance prohibits alcohol in City parks – and grab a seat on the surrounding fields at 500 W. Hidden Creek Pkwy. Snacks will be available at the concession stand. The gates open at 5 p.m. The concert will be followed by a spectacular fireworks show choreographed to patriotic music.

DO YOU WANT TO PLANT A GARDEN?

Apply for a garden plot at the Community Garden at Russell Farm, which is owned by the City. The public area of Russell Farm, 405 W. County Road 714, comprises about 11 acres that is home to the community garden. The garden is open daily, except for Sundays, for garden members and volunteers. Children under 18 are welcome but they must be accompanied by an adult. The annual individual plot rental fee is \$50 for a 5-foot-by-8-foot plot or \$90 for a 5-foot-by-16-foot plot. The fee covers the garden plot with organic top soil medium added, water, and liability insurance. There is also a one-time plot cleanup deposit of \$20. VACCINATE YOUR PETS AGAINST RABIES

Vaccinate your pets against rabies and keep those vaccinations up to date. In April, city council changed the definition of rabies vaccination to include one-year-dose vaccinations or three-year-dose vaccinations. Animals must be vaccinated before 4 months of age and are required to have a booster shot within one year of the initial vaccination. After that, the owner can opt for one-year or three-year vaccinations. To protect yourself and your pets against rabies, avoid animals, both domestic and wild, that appear disoriented, fearless or aggressive. Nighttime animals such as bats, raccoons and skunks that are active in the daytime may be sick. Avoid leaving pet food outdoors, and keep garbage in closed containers. Do not touch any wild animal that appears ill or dead. If you live inside the city limits of Burleson, call Burleson Animal Services at 817-426-9283. For more, go to www.burlesontx.com/rabies.

NO DOGS ALLOWED IN SPECTATOR AREA

Dogs are prohibited from entering through the entryway gates and into the spectator and playing field areas at Chisenhall Fields Sports Complex thanks to an amendment approved by city council in April. Dogs are permitted in the parking lot, pedestrian trail and other undeveloped areas of the park. This ban does not apply to a service animal if the service animal is under the control of its disabled owner and the animal does not pose a direct threat to the health or safety of others. Chisenhall Fields Sports Complex is located at 500 W. Hidden Creek Pkwy.
