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The Burleson Public Library is hosting several community education programs in the next few months, starting with an Adult Diabetes Management Class in August.

A certified diabetes educator will instruct the diabetes class which starts Thursday, Aug. 15. The class is the third Thursday of every month, 1 p.m.-3 p.m., through Dec. 19. These classes will take place in the library's conference room.

Starting Sept. 9, you can learn English as a Second Language (ESL) on Mondays and Wednesdays, 11:30 a.m.-1:45 p.m., in the meeting room at the library. The instructor for this class and the two computer classes is provided through the Cleburne Independent School District's adult education. Classes end Dec. 4 then restart in January.

If you need help with computers, Basic (Introduction) Computer Classes start Monday, Sept. 23, 2 p.m.-4 p.m. in the library meeting room. The computers for this class and the advanced class are provided through a grant from the Texas State Library and Archives Commission. Classes are on Mondays and end Nov. 18.

And, if you are ready for Step Up Advanced Computer Classes, those start Wednesday, Sept. 25, 2 p.m.-4 p.m., in the library's meeting room. Classes are on Wednesdays and end Nov. 20.
