UPDATE (6:45 p.m./Aug. 23): The Tarrant County Medical Examiners Office has confirmed the death of the 5-year-old Burleson boy who was rushed to the hospital after he was found in a hot car. The boy's name is Zachary Elshaarawy. The ME's office lists the time of death as 3 p.m. today, August 23, 2015.

A 5-year-old Burleson boy was rushed to the hospital after he was found in a hot car.

DATE/TIME: Sunday, August 23, 2015, 1:05 p.m.

LOCATION: Residence in the 2700 block of Lakeside Drive

The caller told police that the autistic boy had been missing for approximately 15 minutes. A woman, who identified herself as the child's grandmother, told officers that several people had checked the home. Burleson officers checked the home, a nearby lake, and the area around Hwy. 174.

Burleson firefighters responded shortly before 1:30 p.m. Police officers and firefighters did a sweep of the surrounding area. More than 12 citizens were also on foot and in golf carts searching for the missing child.

A police sergeant searched cars in the driveway and cars on the street. The child was found in the back seat, on the passenger side, of a vehicle parked on the street, between the child's home and the neighbor's home. The sergeant removed the child, who was unconscious, from the vehicle. Firefighters tried to cool the child and started CPR. MedStar ambulance transported the child to Cooks Childrens Hospital in Fort Worth at 2:05 p.m.

The temperature was approximately 100 degrees at the time of the search.
