If you like bluegrass music, you're going to love what Founders Day has to offer this year.

Come on down to Old Town Burleson, Texas, on Saturday, Oct. 10, to hear the Bluefield Express, The Quibble Brothers, Sgt. Pepper's Lonely Bluegrass Band, and Walker and the Texas Dangers! Strains of bluegrass will fill the air between 10 a.m. and 4 p.m. as part of the Founders Day Celebration & Bluegrass Festival.

The Bluefield Express show varies from "hard-drivin', straight ahead bluegrass to ballads, bluegrass instrumentals, gospel and some original compositions." Band members include Cody Crabtree on mandolin, Kenny Williams on banjo, Jay Parker on guitar, Mona Parker on bass, and Gene Pyeatt on fiddle. The Quibble Brothers "are not just a hot Dallas country music band, bluegrass band, and for that matter a swing band . . . they are all that!" The band includes Patrick Bouldin (leader of the "group of misfits"), Richard Gilbert, Chris Plumlee, Liz Patton, Jake Mills, and Linda Relph. Hot Sounds of Summer concert fans will remember Sgt. Pepper's Lonely Bluegrass Band from the 2014 concert series. The band will be back at 1 p.m. on Oct. 10, on that same stage. Sgt. Pepper touts itself as "A Bluegrass Band that plays mostly Beatle songs." The band includes Dave Walser- guitar/vocals, Bach Norwood- bass/vocals, Reggie Rueffer- fiddle/vocals, and Gerald Jones- banjo/mandolin/vocals. Daniel Crim. In early 2011, Walker and his guitarist set out for Nashville where they connected with Andy Gibson, who delivered . . . recording and mixing the band's debut album "Pay the Fiddler." They followed up with a self-titled EP in the spring of 2013, including two songs by banjoist Stephen Simpson. Walker and the Texas Dangers hope to release a third album in the next year.
