BURLESON, TEXAS – On November 5, 2019, just before 6 a.m., Fort Worth Police Department (FWPD) officers responded to a call in the 2500 block of Bomar Ave. where they located an unconscious male, a victim of a gunshot. The man was transported to John Peter Smith (JPS) Hospital where he later died from his injuries. The victim was identified as Mr. Allen Foster, and it was discovered that a silver Chevy Malibu was stolen from Mr. Foster during the crime. In the following days, FWPD Homicide detectives learned that Foster’s stolen car was used in connection to a triple shooting that occurred on Timber Ridge Drive in Burleson, Texas during the early morning hours of November 6th.

Burleson Police Department (BPD) detectives developed a viable suspect lead during their investigation. The suspect was linked to two other shootings that occurred in Fort Worth. Burleson PD, Fort Worth PD, the Johnson County STOP Task Force, and the Texas Rangers worked together to investigate each crime and apprehended the suspect. Henry Anthony McKinney a B/M 30 years of age, was arrested on a traffic stop on Nov. 12 without incident. McKinney is in the Tarrant County jail on three counts of Attempted Capital Murder, Aggravated Robbery with a Deadly Weapon, and Aggravated Assault with a Deadly Weapon. Additional charges to include Capital Murder are forthcoming.

The arrest of Mr. McKinney was the result of a collaborative effort involving several members of Fort Worth PD, Burleson PD, the Johnson County STOP Task Force, Johnson County Sheriff’s Office, and the Texas Rangers.
