**Voting Information**

How do I know where to vote?

- Know what county you live in
  - Johnson or Tarrant
- Johnson County voters
  - **All** Early Voting Burleson Sub-Courthouse, 247 Elk Dr, Room 104, Burleson
  - **NO** Early Voting for City of Burleson elections at any other early voting location in Johnson County
  - **Election Day Voting** All voting will done at your precinct only.
- Tarrant County Voters
  - Use **Any** Early Voting location in Tarrant County
  - All site are listed on their website.

  - Closest location to the city limits of Burleson is Crouch Event Center in Bicentennial Park, 900 E Glendale St, Crowley

What do I need to bring with me to vote in any Texas election including city?

You are required to produce a photo id to vote, there are seven accepted forms:

1. Texas Driver's License
2. Texas Election ID
3. Texas Personal ID
4. Texas Handgun License
5. US Military ID
6. US passport

**All must be original not a copy – may not be expired more than 4 years**

7. US Citizen Certificate

**Must be original not a copy – Cannot be expired must be current**

What if I don't have any of the forms of ID? Can I vote? Short answer is YES.....

Here's how

You don't have ID because you cannot reasonably obtain one, you can vote by filing out an affidavit. Ask for the affidavit and they will provide one at the voting location. You will have produce additional documents to support the affidavit.

- Current utility bill

- Bank statement
- Government check or paycheck
- Other government documents that shows voter's name and address

You can vote a Provisional ballot. Ask for a provisional ballot and they will explain the process to you.

### *What if I want to vote by mail? What are the qualifications to vote by mail?*

You must submit an application for a ballot by mail to the county by **October 23, 2020**

- Know your county – Johnson or Tarrant
  - Johnson county
    - Early Voting Clerk, Patty Bourgeois, Johnson County Election Administrator, PO Box 895, Cleburne, TX 76033
  - Tarrant County
    - Early Voting Clerk, Heider I. Garcia, Tarrant County Election Administrator, PO Box 961011, Fort Worth, TX 76161-0011

Qualifications to vote by mail.

- Be 65 years or older
- Be sick or disabled
- Be out of the county on election day and during the period for early voting by personal appearance
- Be confined in jail but otherwise eligible
