

Voters

- Must be registered 30 days prior to election to vote
 - Go to www.votetexas.gov
 - Johnson County
 - [Register to Vote | Johnson County, TX \(johnsoncountytexas.org\)](http://johnsoncountytexas.org)
 - Tarrant County
 - [Register to Vote \(tarrantcounty.com\)](http://tarrantcounty.com)
- Deadline to register is April 6, 2023
- Voter must know if they live in Johnson or Tarrant County
- Sample ballots will be on the website and posted here at city hall
- What do voters need to vote

Here is a list of the acceptable forms of photo ID:

Texas Driver License issued by the Texas Department of Public Safety (DPS)

Texas Election Identification Certificate issued by DPS

Texas Personal Identification Card issued by DPS

Texas Handgun License issued by DPS

United States Military Identification Card containing the person's photograph

United States Citizenship Certificate containing the person's photograph

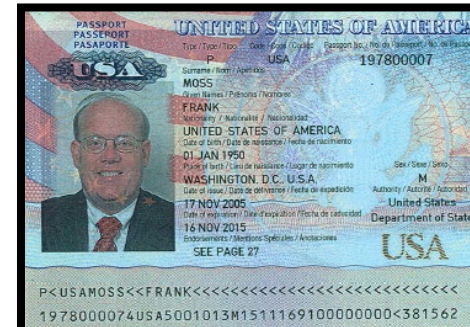
United States Passport (book or card)

Voter ID rules and exceptions:

Tell voters to bring a photo ID to the polling place

Generally, 7 forms of photo ID are approved:

1. Texas driver license issued by the Texas Department of Public Safety (DPS)
 2. Texas Election Identification Certificate issued by DPS
 3. Texas personal identification card issued by DPS
 4. Texas license to carry a handgun issued by DPS
 5. United States military identification card containing the person's photograph
 6. United States citizenship certificate containing the person's photograph
 7. United States passport
- ❖ Must be original photo ID, not copies
 - ❖ With the exception of the U.S. citizenship certificate; voters 18-69 years of age must have photo ID that is current or not expired more than 4 years from the date of the election.



Voter with no ID:

If a voter does not have a photo ID, they can still vote if:

- The voter is not reasonably able to obtain an approved photo ID, **and**
- The voter executes an affidavit stating that they have a reasonable impediment to obtaining a photo ID, **and**
- The voter provides additional approved documents (current utility bill, bank statement, government check, or paycheck, or other government document that shows the voter's name and an address)

“Reasonable impediments” include lack of transportation, disability or illness, lack of birth certificate or other documents needed to obtain acceptable photo ID, work schedule, family responsibilities, lost or stolen photo ID, or photo ID applied for but not received. You may also describe another reasonable impediment you have on the Reasonable Impediment Declaration form

Where to Vote:

First

Know what county you live in. All Burleson voters must live inside the city limits of Burleson HOWEVER there are 2 counties – Johnson and Tarrant

Double check before going to the polls to vote the counties website for the latest information
